PRECURSILLO CHAIRS – What Do They Do?

The purpose of Cursillo is for all people to know the Good News: God loves them...loves us. This purpose is accomplished through the Holy Spirit by the way of *friendship*, so that those who attend a Cursillo will have the experience that Christ loves them. Precursillo is the first phase in the method of Cursillo which aims to bring us to a 3-Day Cursillo phase and the Postcursillo phase, and then generates anew the Precursillo, in a continuous circle.

In the Diocese of Charlotte, the role of the Precursillo Chairpersons requires membership in the Cursillo Secretariat. This ensures that the Movement maintains its focus on identifying leaders within the diocese.

The Precursillo Chairs make sure that the proper procedures are in place to have a smooth transition from Precursillo to Postcursillo. Their responsibilities are to study the environments and search for candidates within those environments. The Chairs must make certain that the selection and preparation of the candidates are implemented properly. They work with the candidates, sponsors, and Ultreya leaders before the Weekend to answer any questions about the application process and Weekend itself, so that there is a smooth transition to the candidates' 4th Day.

Another responsibility of the Chairs is to conduct workshops so that sponsors or groups sponsoring candidates *know* their candidates and have a *sincere friendship* with them. Further, it is important to communicate all necessary information about the candidates to the Rectors.

As you can see, without a well-planned Precursillo phase, and the vigilant activities of its Chairs, the 3-Day and Postcursillo phases could be negatively impacted. As noted earlier, it is our mission to transition from pre-Weekend to 3-Day, and ultimately post-Weekend, seamlessly!

Palanca Requests

If you open the National Cursillo USA website, you will find the following listings: My Resource Center, Cursillo Literature, What is Cursillo?, Links & Contacts, Forms and Memo, National Newsletter, and Palanca Requests. Now, you may not have been aware of this last category as a section unto its own. First, the site defines the palanca letter as a letter..."that is sent to the candidates and team, informing them of the prayers and sacrifices that you are offering to God on their behalf. A letter may be sent explaining what type of palanca is being offered, but the letter is NOT the palanca. The palanca is the action – intercessory prayer, sacrifice, or works of mercy, and it can be done without writing a letter." Second, by subscribing, you can receive an electronic reminder weekly of upcoming events and Weekends. Third, an > ADD YOUR EVENT button allows you to add your own Cursillo Weekend to the website. In our diocese, Patty Mead, our Palanca Coordinator, handles this. (See the current listing in the table below.)
