Well it's Fall already and who would have thought that we would still be in the middle of the COVID doldrums when this first started in back in March. Worse yet, it now looks like we have a long way to go before we return to anything approaching "normal."

These are not easy days for us Cursillistas. Our charism is to proclaim "the best news – that God, in Jesus Christ, loves us – by the best means – which is friendship." Friendship, in turn, is all about interpersonal relationships – making friends, being friends, and bringing friends to Christ. How do we do all this in a COVID world?

Surprisingly, the answer is: Much the same way we did it before all this craziness began — only the *method of communication* has changed. Whereas in the pre-COVID world we might meet someone for lunch to discuss Cursillo, now we might have to use the phone. (You remember the phone? It was the thing we used before email, text, and Instagram.) And 4th Day Reunion Groups? Well, we used to meet at a restaurant or someone's home — Now our meetings have moved online via Zoom or other video conference call technology. Even our largest gatherings (Ultreya and School of Leaders) are still going strong — just not in person. Over 50 people attended our last School of Leaders online. Some Ultreyas are recording record numbers.

The bottom line is that our obligation as Cursillistas has not changed. Only the method of communication has changed. "Far away" Catholics still need a new relationship with Jesus Christ and our movement is still one of the best ways to make that happen. Jesus Christ is counting on us. Let's not use COVID-19 as an excuse for sitting back and telling ourselves "I'll get to it later when things get back to normal." Pick up the phone. Reach out to potential candidates. Explain the Cursillo movement to them. Invite them to group with you. If anything, people are more isolated now and in need of friendship. A call from you might mean more now than ever before. Let's treat COVID-19 as an opportunity instead of an excuse. Souls are at stake. "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few."

If you have not been meeting with your 4th Day Reunion Group, reach out and set up a Zoom call. Don't know how to do that? Call me, it's really simple. Not holding your Ultreya meetings online? Call me, it's really simple. Not attending School of Leaders? Now it's easier than ever. No travel, just click online. My dear friends, life goes on and so does Cursillo. It's time to make lemonade out of the COVID lemons, and we are just the people to do it.

And, as it reviews "Step by Step" (the updated Weekend Manual), and the reasoning behind it, the team grows more and more into a Christian community, based on friendship!
- Lastly, the Secretariat has not skipped a beat with monthly meetings, utilizing its Tracking Report to ensure that all projects are on target, and goals and deadlines are being met, but most importantly, keeping its focus on the Movement, ensuring that it continues to flourish under the Charism of Eduardo Bonnin.
